Pile burnings

The Bureau of Land Management Alaska Fire Service will be burning approximately two acres of wood debris piles between now and March 23 when weather conditions are favorable for adequate smoke dispersal.

The piles are located three miles northeast of Eielson Air Force Base on Fort Wainwright Yukon Training Area at Moose Creek.

The piles were created last spring during hazardous-fuel reduction thinning operations.

Smoke from the prescribed burn may be visible in the Eielson, Moose Creek and North Pole areas.
