Soldiers and families can learn more about the migratory birds that may be seen in the area during a free, guided nature walk at Creamer's Field at 1300 College Road in Fairbanks. Friends of Creamer's Field Naturalists lead the nature walks on the refuge trails, allowing visitors to learn more about the wonders of Alaska and the Creamer's Field Migratory Waterfowl Refuge.
