

Armon Adams at the Fort Richardson Tax Assistance Center located in Bldg. 600, Rm. 305. The tax center is currently open Monday through Wednesday from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., Thursdays from 1 to 8 p.m. and Fridays from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. All tax preparers are trained by the Internal Revenue Service and are able to provide e-filing for their customers. Important documents to bring when filing taxes include a copy of last year's return, taxpayer's proof of identity, all W-2 forms, 1098s and 1099s, other information about additional income, identification numbers for any childcare providers, a voided check or proof of bank account for direct deposit of refund, and if applicable, social security cards for spouse, children or other dependents. The center is open for appointments and walk-ins. For more information or to make an appointment, call 384-1040. All active duty, mobilized Reserve Component members, retirees and family members of these sponsors who have simple, non-complex tax returns are eligible for this free tax assistance service. The tax center will remain open for business until April 15.
