combat zone.

That's 180 days plus another 105 days for the number of days from the day in February 2009 the Soldier enters Afghanistan through April 15, 2009, and Jan. 1, 2010, through the day in February 2010 the Soldier departs Afghanistan.

If a Soldier is entitled to the combat zone extension but reenters a combat zone before the prior ex-

tension period expired, the Soldier is entitled to a new 180-day period beginning after the Soldier leaves the combat zone for the second time.

In addition, any of the unused time remaining in the prior extension period is added to the new 180-day period.

In general, spouses of individuals who served in a combat zone are also entitled to the same deadline extension for the filing of federal income tax returns.

Taxpayers who serve in a combat zone should write "COMBAT ZONE" in red ink at the top of the first page of the tax return.

### Can families move while Soldiers are deployed?

Yes, after coordination with the Housing Office if they are living in government quarters or are renting a property in the Preferred Tenant

Program.

### Do family members have to reside in government quarters?

No.

### Will dual military have to do anything special to obtain quarters?

No.

### If I had elected the option of clearing quarters and household goods are in storage, can I get loaner furniture?

No.
