Combined Federal Campaign (CFC)

Kicks off

**October 4 thru
 November 12**



History: The campaign was established in 1963, and is the only authorized yearly fund-raising campaign for federal employees and military personnel to contribute to non-profit organizations.


The campaign is conducted by the federal government, through the Office of Personnel Management (OPM), the CFC operates in over 400 communities throughout the U.S., Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands.

Federal donors directly designate their contributions to more than 1,000 charitable organizations based on a list of eligible agencies developed by OPM. These agencies must demonstrate to OPM that they are charitable institutions with 501(c)(3) status and that they conduct real services and/or program activities, among other criteria. As potential recipients of funds raised by the CFC, United Ways in those communities, are registered on the OPM list the same as all other eligible agencies.

United Ways have no control over the list of eligible charities or the distribution of designated funds. This control falls directly under federal authority.

OPM authorizes Local Federal Coordination Committees (LFCC) to organize the CFC and appoint a "Principal Combined Fund Organization" (PCFO) to manage the campaign. In the majority of communities, United Ways are the designated PCFO. As PCFO's, United Ways are responsible for managing the day-to-day operations of the Combined Federal Campaign.
