MEMORANDUM FOR SEE DISTRIBUTION

SUBJECT: Fort Richardson Running Route Policy (#24-19)

1. Running safety is every soldier's responsibility, not just the leader! Ft. Richardson has established running routes that help protect the soldier as well as assist with our military, family and civilian workforce travel on and off the installation. This policy letter reinforces and further explains the current color-coded running route. The following designated routes indicate the authorized activities associated with each of the running routes (see attached map). The only exception to vehicular traffic on any of the running routes is for emergency vehicles only.

a. The Blue route is for both vehicles and runners. Individual runners and small groups, (squad or fewer) will only use the sidewalks that are cleared and will not interfere or block vehicular traffic. Squad elements and smaller running on Arctic Valley Road will not impeded vehicular traffic at any time.

b. The Red Route is for vehicles only. Runners are not authorized on this route at any time day or night. The Red Dotted Route is for limited local use, and should be avoided, even though running and vehicular traffic is authorized.

c. The Yellow Route is for runners only during standard Physical Training (PT) times. No vehicles are authorized use of these routes during the hours of 0630-0730 daily, to include Thursdays.

2. Unit runs of any size are not authorized in any of the housing areas on the installation. No cadence calling is permitted in the housing areas.

3. A unit run of a company sized element or larger must request and receive approval from the Post Commander to use any or all of a restricted or limited use running route prior to conducting the run. Appropriate coordination will be made with the Military Police and the Union representative.

4. There are no changes to the barricade plan during PT hours. Assigned units will have soldiers assigned to secure these intersections and they will wear and have the following safety equipment; a road guard vest or yellow reflective belt, carry a flash light during hours of darkness, appropriate weather related uniform items and be posted at the intersection NLT 0615.

| f. Special Troops Battalion | Corner of Davis Hwy and 5 th Street |


