SUBJECT: Extremist Organization Participation (CG/CofS Policy Statement #0-26)


1. Reference AR 600-20, subparagraph 4-12.
2. Extremist activities will not be tolerated in this command. Soldiers will not participate in the activities of any extremist organization. Soldiers who violate this policy may be subject to adverse administrative action or disciplinary action under the Uniform Code of Military Justice (UCMJ).
3. Extremist organizations and activities are ones that advocate racial, gender, or ethnic hatred or intolerance; advocate, create or engage in illegal discrimination based on race, color, gender, sex, religion, or national origin; or advocate the use of force or violence, or unlawful means to deprive individuals of their rights. The following activities in support of extremist organizations or causes are specifically prohibited:
 - a. Participating in public demonstration or rally.
 - b. Attending a meeting or activity with knowledge that the meeting or activity involves an extremist cause, when it constitutes a breach of law or order, when violence is likely to result, or when in violation of off-limits sanctions, or a commander's order.
 - c. Fund raising.
 - d. Recruiting or training members.
 - e. Creating, organizing, or taking a visible leadership role in such an organization or activity.
 - f. Distributing literature on or off a military installation which advocates or supports extremist causes, organizations, or activities, and when the literature presents a clear danger to the loyalty, discipline, or morale of military personnel, or the distribution would materially interfere with the accomplishment of a military mission.

SUBJECT: Extremist Organization Participation (CG/CofS Policy Statement #0-26)

g. Placement of flags, posters, or symbols that are associated with extremist organizations, activities, or causes in barracks rooms or United States Army Alaska facilities.

4. Subordinate commanders may prohibit military personnel from engaging in any other activity that the commander determines will adversely affect good order, discipline, or morale within the command.
